Subject: Service Agreement between the County of Riverside and City of Lake Elsinore for Palomar Street Slurry Seal Improvements

Recommendation

Authorize the City Manager to execute a Cooperative Agreement with Riverside County to slurry seal Palomar Street from Skylark Drive to Corydon Street within the city limits, in an amount not to exceed \$64,855.84 and in such final form as approved by the City Attorney.

Background

As part of its annual slurry seal and microsurfacing program, The County of Riverside has awarded All American Asphalt a countywide slurry seal project. The project was advertised on November 6, 2018, and bids were opened on November 28, 2018. The City will benefit from cost savings resulting from a larger maintenance program, which generally yields lower bid prices.

Within the City's jurisdiction, the pavement is approximately 2,760 ft. in length and 46 ft. in width. The total asphalt surface area is approximately 14,107 square yards.

Discussion

The low bidder for the County project is All American Asphalt., from Corona, CA. The contractor will perform:

- Slurry Seal Type II within the City Limits for length and widths mentioned in the project background.
- Thermoplastic striping for crosswalk and pavement markings.
- Thermoplastic traffic striping
- Reflective pavement markers
- Rout and seal cracks.
- Provide traffic control for the entire duration of the project.

- The work also includes removing existing striping and pavement markers.

In addition, the cooperative agreement allows the County of Riverside to provide administrative, technical, managerial, and support services necessary to assist the City in completing the project.

Fiscal Impact

Funding for the cooperative agreement for \$64,855.84, will be from unused contingency from the Slurry Seal Project at Central Ave that was completed in 2017. These funds are owed by the County to the City. Central Ave slurry seal was funded through the relinquishment funds received from Caltrans.
